Scholarship and Application Policies

The *application deadlines* are as follows:

- ◆ **March 1** for participants in summer, fall semester, or academic year programs
- ◆ **October 15** for participants in spring semester programs.

The International Programs Committee considers the following ranked criteria in making its decision:

1. Length of program
2. GPA
3. Academic strength and preparedness, maturity, and adaptability
4. Quality of Statement of Purpose regarding benefit of study abroad
5. Anticipated long-term effect of study abroad on study and/or career plans
6. Financial need
7. Other criteria deemed relevant by the Committee

Students applying for a scholarship to go on a program in which they have already participated will not be awarded funding. However, this does NOT exclude applicants who want to travel to the same country on a fundamentally different program.

If a scholarship recipient is unable to complete the proposed study abroad program for any reason other than a documented case of extreme emergency, he or she must repay all funds awarded within 30 days of dismissal or withdrawal from the program. This includes, but is not limited to, early dismissal from a program for academic or behavioral reasons.

Students who do not receive a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 for the courses taken on the study abroad program must repay the full amount of the scholarship within 30 days of notification of grades.

Acceptance of this funding obligates students to publicize the opportunities and advantages of overseas study upon their return (such as speaking before a student group or writing an article for the campus paper).
