



# Finding TABLES OF CONTENTS

Many of the periodical index databases available from the IUS Library website have features which function as current awareness/tables-of-contents services. Look for a “Browse Journals” option, or a search option for “publications.” Instructions for finding tables of contents in selected databases follow:

**Academic Search:** In the EbscoHost menu entry for Academic Search, click on “Title List.” Type in the title or partial title. Click on the date of the issue desired. Article citations are arranged in page number order.

**Professional Development Collection** (full-text education resources available from Ebscohost): Follow the Academic Search instructions.

**ABI/Inform Global:** Click on the “Search Methods” option at the top. Click on “Publications.” Type in the title or partial title desired. Click on the blue title in the title list. Click on the date of the issue desired. These citations are arranged alphabetically by title of article.

**Ingenta** (formerly CARLUncover): Click on “browse by publication” below the search box. Type in the title or partial title of journal. Select “current issue” or “all issues.” Click on date desired. Article citations are arranged in page number order.

**Journals@Ovid:** Click on “Browse Journals” option at top of page. Select desired title from alphabetical list. Click on issue list. Click “tables of contents” of desired issue. These are listed in reverse page number order.

**Wiley Journals Full-Text:** Click on “JournalFinder” at top of page. Scroll down to type in desired title. Click on “current issue.” Article citations arranged in page number order.

**PsychINFO:** In the EbscoHost menu entry for PsychInfo, click on “Title List.” Type in the title or partial title. Click on the date of the issue desired. Article citations are arranged in page number order.

Other available databases (though not all) also allow you to find current tables of contents. Look for similar options in your favorite databases. And if you need assistance of any kind, stop by or call the IUS Library Reference Desk, 941-2489.
