



Grove Dictionary of Art Online

BEGINNER'S GUIDE

COVERAGE: Provides Web access to the entire text of *The Dictionary of Art* (1996, 34 vols.) with quarterly updates and constant additions of new material. It currently has more than 45,000 full articles covering every aspect of the visual arts from prehistory through the present, with links to more than 120,000 images.

ACCESS: From the Library web page, (www.ius.edu/Library), click on "Article and Database Search" (under FIND INFORMATION.) Scroll down to the Alphabetical List and select Grove Dictionary of Art. From off-campus log in as prompted.

BASIC INSTRUCTIONS:

1. For an article search, type in your term in the box at the top of the page and click on "Go". This will give you a list of articles whose title includes the term you typed. Click on the green title of each article you want to view . The article will provide a table of contents; click on the items you wish to view.
2. For a full-text search, click on "Full text" under Advanced Search on the first screen. Type in your term and click "Search"; you will get a list of articles in which your term is mentioned somewhere in the article. (The articles which mention your term most are listed first.)
3. You may also "Browse" search the index and the articles. Select that option.
4. To print, click on "File" in your browser toolbar.
For Internet Explorer, choose from the dialog box the frame you wish to print.
In Netscape, click on "Print Frame" from the file menu.
5. To link to images, click on "Links" or "Bridgeman."
