



# JSTOR

## **BEGINNER'S GUIDE**

**COVERAGE:** This database provides full-text backfiles of more than 500 scholarly journals in the fields of African American Studies, Anthropology, Asian Studies, Classical Studies, Ecology, Economics, Education, Geography, Finance, History, History of Science and Technology, Literature, Mathematics, Music, Philosophy, Political Science, Population Studies, Sociology, and Statistics. (By agreement with the publishers, the most recent articles are not made available here.)

**ACCESS:** From the Library web page ([www.ius.edu/Library](http://www.ius.edu/Library)) .Click on "Article and Database Search" (under FIND INFORMATION.) Scroll down to the Shortcuts and select JSTOR. (From off-campus, log in if prompted.)

### **BASIC INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. Click on "Search JSTOR"
2. Type in your search terms and click "Search." (For more sophisticated search Options, click on "Advanced Search" or "Article Location.")
3. Scroll down the page for the list of articles retrieved.
4. To view a particular article, click on "Link to article" and follow instructions if that is an available option; if not, click the "Download" option and select PDF high quality; this will allow you to read the article in PDF format before you actually download or print it. If article is not available, ask librarian for help.
5. To print an article, click on the "Print" option of the citation. Click on "Proceed with Printing". Printing options vary depending on the configuration of the workstation you are using, but generally your article will appear in a browser window (eventually.) Click on the browser's print option. (If you do not have Acrobat Reader on your workstation, you will have to download it in order to print the whole article.)
