

INSTRUCTIONS FOR EARNING CPR/AED/HEIMLICH CERTIFICATION

CPR-Heimlich Maneuver-AED Certification

Per IC 20-28-5-3(c), applicants applying for an initial teaching license must have successfully completed training in:

- cardiopulmonary resuscitation that includes a test demonstration on a mannequin,
- removing a foreign body causing an obstruction in an airway, and the Heimlich Maneuver; and
- beginning July 1, 2011, the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED);
- and hold a valid certification in each of these procedures from either the American Red Cross or the American Heart Association or other providers as approved by the department.

An initial teaching license is the first license issued to an applicant, regardless of content area or setting. Beginning July 1, 2012, the requirements above must be met for all license and permit renewals.

Substitute teacher permits and educational interpreter permits are exempt.

CPR-Heimlich Maneuver training may be delivered primarily on-line, but it must include a "hands-on" training/demonstration component with a mannequin.
