1. Must have a minimum of 130 hours to graduate with at least a 2.5 GPA.
2. Courses noted with * are the courses that need to be completed before applying to begin Block 1. The Praxis I (PPST) must also be attempted before application.
3. Content areas noted with the + sign must have a combined GPA of 2.5 or above. (over)

Additional information regarding the Elementary Education degree program:

1. Passing scores on the Praxis I are as follows: Math - 175, Reading - 176, Writing - 172. Student who have not obtained these scores before entering Block 1 will have to enroll in a Praxis Prep workshop during that block. These scores are necessary for admission to Block 2 and the Elementary Education Program.
2. Must complete the Language Arts content area (W131, W300, S121, and literature course) by the end of the General Methods block (Block 2) with no grade lower than C and a 2.5 overall content GPA.
3. Can have only one social studies content course not completed by the start of Block 3 (Reading/Language Arts/Social Studies Methods Block). This remaining social studies content course must be taken concurrently with Block 3.
4. Must complete T101, T102, and T103 prior to Block 4 (Math/Science Methods Block). Must have a minimum grade of C in each T course with at least a 2.5 GPA among the three T courses.
5. Can have only one science content course not completed by start of Block 4 (Mathematics/Science Methods Block). This remaining science content course must be taken concurrently with Block 4.
6. Must complete E449 prior to Block 4 (Mathematics/Science Methods Block). E449 must be taken with Block 2 or 3. It can not be taken with Block 1.
7. Must have all courses completed prior to Block 5 (Student Teaching Block).
8. Must complete art content course prior to taking M333 (Art Experience for the Elementary Teacher); must complete music content course prior to taking M323 (Teaching Music in the Elementary School).
9. The course W200 (Computers in Education) is a pre-requisite for the course W310 (Computer Based Teaching Methods). You may either take W200 as an elective or test out of this course.
10. Courses on this checksheet fulfill the University's general education requirements. The Elementary Education program strongly suggests students take the recommended content courses. Courses not on the checksheet may be accepted as substitutions, assuming the class content is similiar to the course being substituted, in each category. However, students must submit a formal petition and receive approval for EACH substitution desired.
