



# MLA Bibliography

## *Beginner's Guide*

**COVERAGE:** This database provides citations for items from over 6000 sources worldwide, including journals, books, essay collections, working papers, proceedings, and dissertations in the fields of literature, folklore, language, and linguistics, from 1963 to the present. Links to full text of some articles.

**ACCESS:** From the Library web page ([www.ius.edu/Library](http://www.ius.edu/Library)), click on "Article and Database Search" (under FIND INFORMATION.) Scroll down to the Alphabetical List and select MLA International Bibliography. (From off-campus, log in as prompted.)

### BASIC INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Type in your search terms. (You may scroll down and limit your search to peer-reviewed materials by clicking the appropriate box, or to a specific journal by typing in its title.) Then click on "Search."
2. To view an article, click on the "HTML full-text" or "PDF full-text" notation in the citation. (If there is no full text notation available, IUS may own the print periodical or you may get it through interlibrary loan—ask at the Reference Desk.)
3. To print an article:
  - For HTML: Click on the blue print notation at top of page. Click on "Print" and "OK" if prompted. Alternately, you can just click on your browser print option.
  - For PDF: Wait for Adobe reader to load. Then click on the print icon IN THE ADOBE SCREEN—the one closest to the text. (If you use your browser print options with PDF the article will not print.)
4. You may also e-mail or download an article. Click on the "E-mail" or "Save" option at the top of the screen and follow instructions.
