Welcome to Indiana University Southeast!

Between adjusting to campus life, your new classmates, and your class load, you probably could use a few helpful hints from someone who knows the University. Here's an opportunity for you to get that kind of help for the academic year... **Become an Access To Success Student!**

What is 'Access To Success'?

Access To Success is a free one-year program developed to help you make the transition from high school or work to IU Southeast more successfully. In this program you will work one-on-one with other students, faculty, and staff who will guide you to improve your chances of earning your degree.

What's Involved in the Program?

You'll be assigned a student peer mentor who has been trained to help you. Besides helping you adjust to IU Southeast, your mentor will:

- Introduce you to the support services and resources on campus.
- Show you how to use the technology and help you get acquainted with the IU network and online tools.
- Introduce you to campus activities to show you the co-curricular side of college life.

Responsibilities of an Access To Success Student

- Regularly meet with your assigned Peer Mentor during the academic year (Summer, Fall, and Spring)
- Actively participate in the Center for Mentoring activities and events

Benefits of Being an Access To Success Student

- Assigned a personal Peer Mentor for your first year at IU Southeast
- Receive advice regarding college expectations
- Introduction to campus culture, campus services and university facilities
- Engagement through Center for Mentoring activities and events

Qualifications of an Access To Success Student

{Must be admitted to IU Southeast}

Meet one of the following criteria:

- Twenty-First Century Scholar
- Minority Student
- Adult Learner (age 25+)
- First-generation College Student
